Instructions

Before you start making these bath bombs please check the contents of your kit are all there and read through the instructions before you start. This kit is designed for beginners and will make 2 different scented bath bombs. Each mix will make 6 x 65g bath bombs.

You will need:
Greaseproof paper
Plastic bowl
Sieve

Contents

- 2 x Bags Bicarbonate of soda (Sodium Bicarbonate) 300g
- 2 x Bags of Citric Acid 150g
- 1 x bottle Sweet Almond oil 30ml
- 2 x 5ml bottles of fragrance oil
- 2 x 5ml bottles of colour
- 2 x 5g bags Petals
- 2 pairs Latex gloves
- 2 x Plastic Cups
- 2 x Moulds (1x heart and 1 x star)
- Witch Hazel Spray
- 1 x 50g bag sodium bicarbonate (for dusting your moulds)
- Cellophane to wrap your bombs in
- Instruction Sheet

Top Tip
Before you start, place a piece of greaseproof paper on the work surface for your finished bath bombs to dry on.

Top Tip
If your bath bomb falls apart as you put it on the greaseproof paper, just scoop it up and knead it in your bowl with a spritz of witch hazel and try again.

Top Tip
If you want to make a two toned bath bomb mix them separately and join the two halves in the moulds at the end.

Top Tip
If your mixture starts to dry out, spray a little witch hazel into the mix and knead again.

Top Tip
You can use ice cube moulds or just press the mixture firmly into the moulds and leave in the moulds for approximately one hour until set hard then press out.

Stage 1

1. Put gloves on before starting.
2. Sieve one bag of the Sodium Bicarbonate into the plastic bowl.
3. Add one bag of the citric acid breaking up any lumps with your fingers and mix together with your hands.

Stage 2

4. Pour half the Sweet Almond oil into the small plastic cup provided, and then add 50 drops of fragrance oil to the Sweet Almond oil.
5. Next add the colouring to the mixture. Add 20 drops of colouring for lightly coloured bath bombs or 60 drops for a more intense colour.

Stage 3

8. Pour all of the contents of the cup into the bowl of sodium bicarbonate and citric acid and mix together with your hands until the mixture starts to stick together making sure to disperse the oils well into the mix.
9. Add the flower petals and mix together again.

Stage 4

10. Dust the inside of your moulds with the extra bag of sodium bicarbonate to stop the mixture sticking to them.
11. Fill both sides of the moulds with the mixture (heaped), then squeeze the moulds together.
12. Press the two halves together for a few seconds. The two halves of the moulds will sit approximately 5mm apart leaving a ring around the bath bomb.
13. Carefully squeeze the sides of the moulds to release the bath bombs. You can also tap the moulds on the table gently to help them release the bath bombs.
14. The bath bombs are very fragile so place them on greaseproof paper and leave them alone for an hour to set.
15. Once they have set, wrap in cellophane and leave over night to harden up, they are then ready to use!
